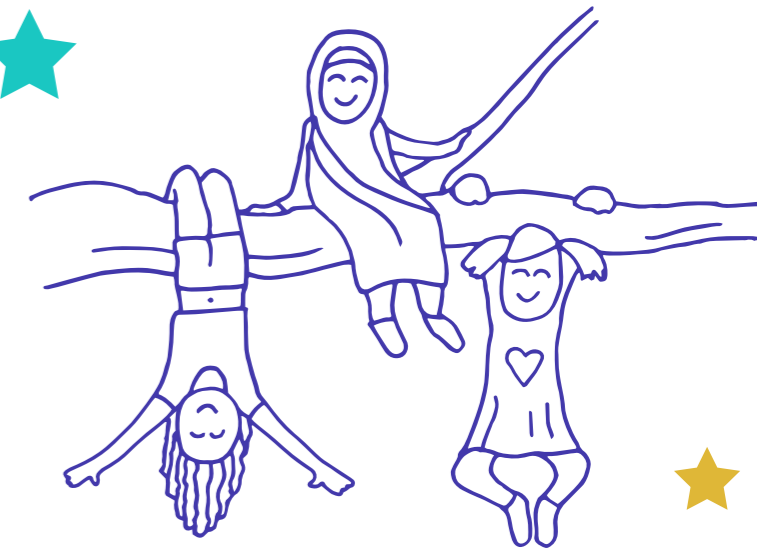

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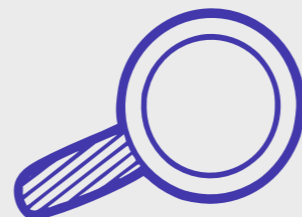

Welcome to Natasha's Foundation



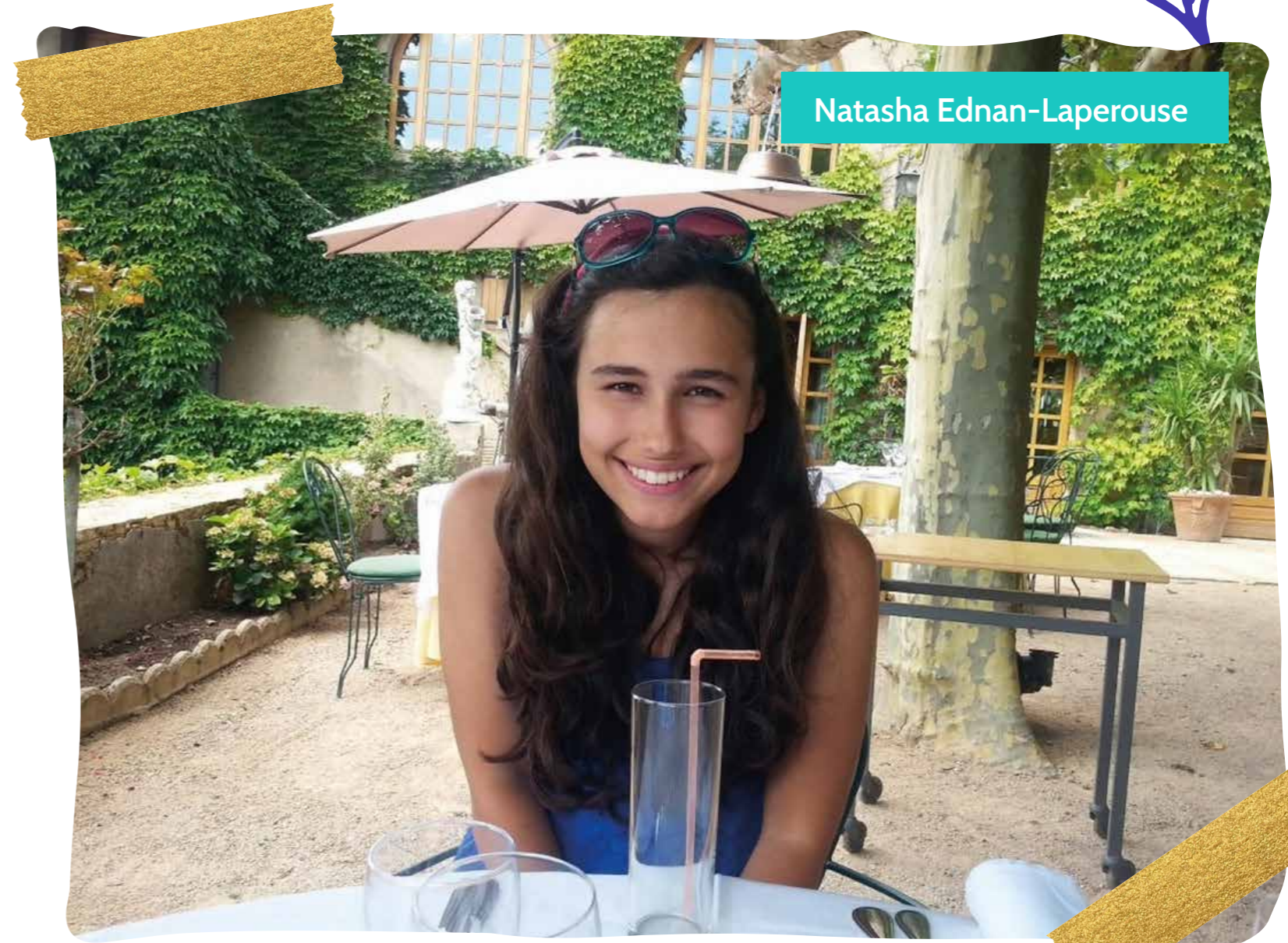
Natasha's Foundation, the UK's food allergy charity, was founded by Nadim and Tanya Ednan-Laperouse OBEs after their daughter Natasha died aged 15 from a severe allergic reaction to sesame.

Natasha ate a sandwich that failed to mention sesame on its ingredients label and the seeds were not visible, they were baked into the dough of the bread.

Had the sandwich been properly labelled, Natasha would never have eaten it. Natasha's death was entirely preventable - it should not have happened.

Through campaigning, education and research, the charity's mission is to **make allergy history**, in particular food allergy, and improve the lives of the millions of people in the UK living with food allergies.

We want to understand what is causing the dramatic rise in allergic disease and develop ways to prevent, treat and ultimately eradicate it.

Allergy School



Allergy School is a **FREE** educational programme from Natasha's Foundation. It has been designed to help teachers create inclusive and safe environments in nurseries, primary schools and out-of-school clubs and groups for children aged 3 to 11 with food allergies.

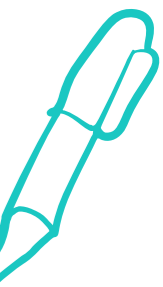
Everyone child deserves to feel safe and protected in school. However, children with food allergies can often feel excluded and this can have a huge impact on their ability to join in activities safely in and out of the classroom.

With around 2 children in every classroom now having a diagnosed food allergy and 20% of food allergic reactions



occurring in schools, Allergy School has never been more important. The suite of **FREE**, high-quality, expert-led resources has been designed to **empower educators to protect every child** and foster understanding among all pupils.

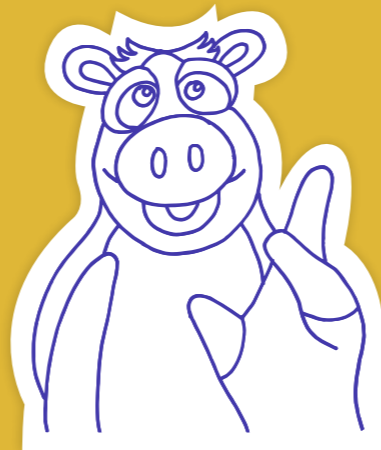
Arlo's Drawing Competition

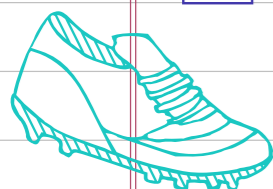

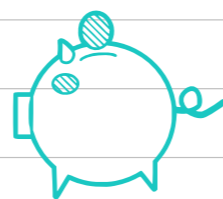


1. Pick your fundraising activity



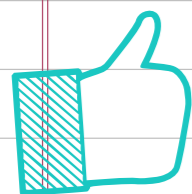

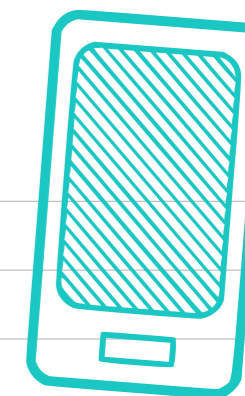


4. Spread the word

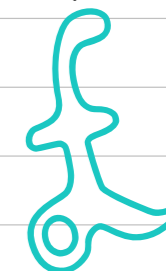

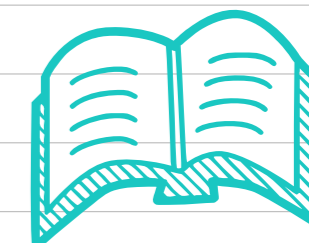

Here are some key facts and messages you can use to talk to parents about fundraising for Natasha's Foundation:

Around **one in 13** children

has a food allergy, that's roughly two children in every classroom.



Food allergies have **doubled**

in a decade and tend to affect children.

How Allergy School is helping



Natasha's Foundation has created Allergy School to help everyone with food allergies feel empowered, included and protected.

Billie's story

Billie Hoque, from Luton, has three children with food allergies. Her son Jess, aged 8, is allergic to cow's milk and has experienced several near-death allergic reactions.

"Jess faced an uphill battle at school as a result of his food allergies. The school struggled to comprehend the severity of his allergies, and he was often **excluded** from activities or put in dangerous situations where his allergen was present.

"This led him to experience severe **anxiety** when he was just 4 years old. He would wake in the night and tell me he hated school and that he felt lonely due to feeling different.

"I am so pleased that Natasha's Foundation has launched Allergy School. I do not doubt that **this will save lives** and also **improve the mental wellbeing** of our allergic children at school."



Michele's story

Michele Barrett is Executive Headteacher at Vanessa Nursery and Randolph Beresford Nursery in London.

"Many children arrive at school with known, and some unknown allergies. The school's approach to **inclusion** includes keeping children safely in school when they have allergies or medical needs. This creates a huge amount of work, not only for the senior leadership team but for all staff.

Having support from Allergy School and a bank of resources and information, helps to create not only policy but best practice. **All schools should be allergy safe schools.**"

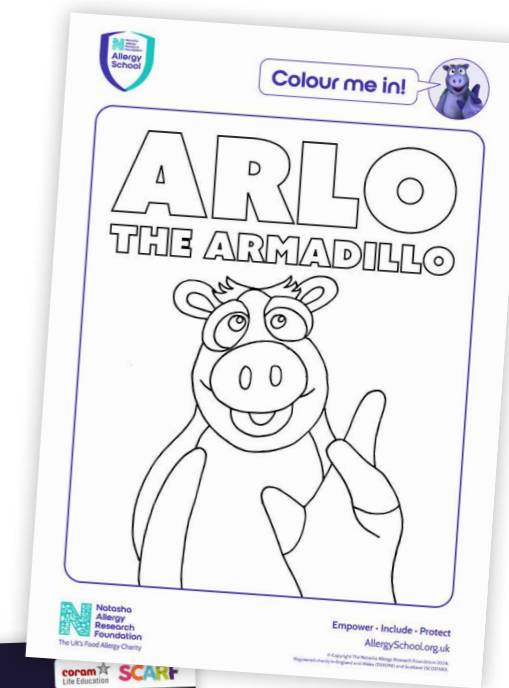
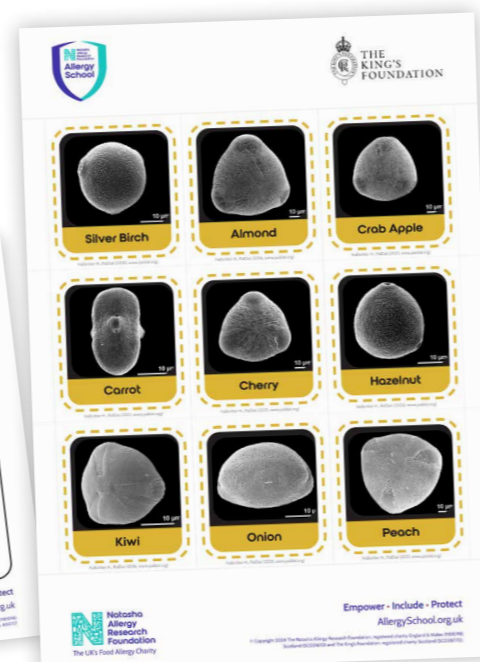

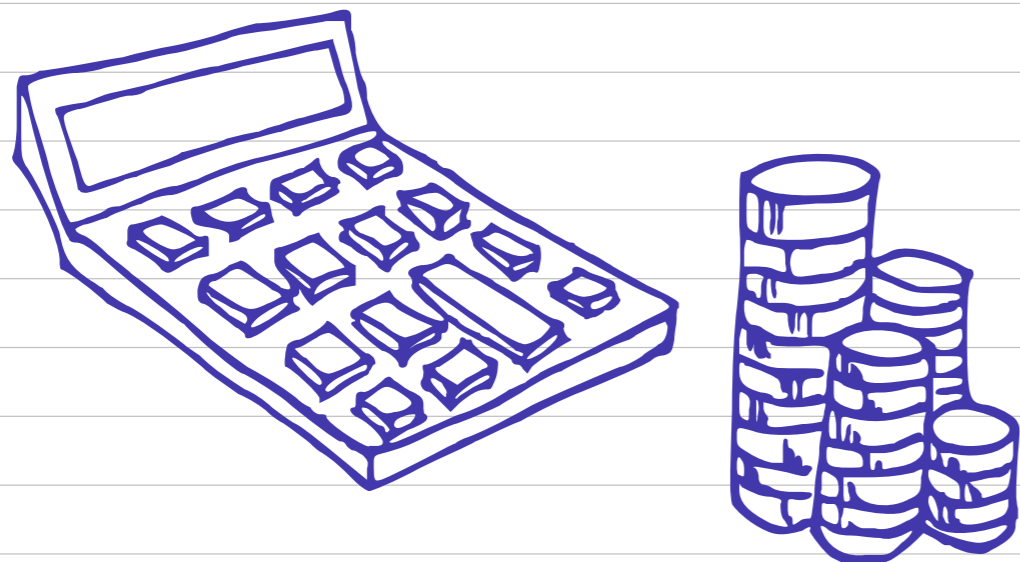

Enthuse

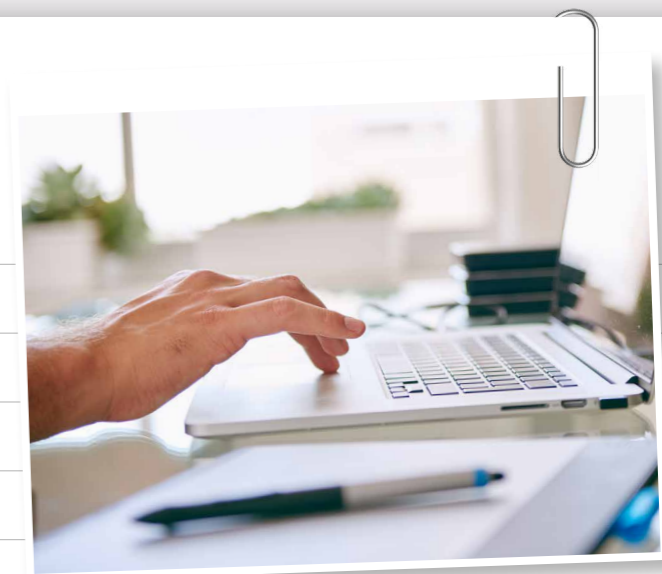


You can pay in your fundraising as a one-off donation on Enthuse. Please make sure you let us know about your fundraising and include a note, so we know who the kind donation is from!
